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4. Collaboration between Geological Survey of India (GSI) and Department of Geology , Government College Kasaragod

A visit by the Department of Geology to the Samudra Ratnakar ship provided insights into various geological processes, especially those related to marine geology and oceanography. Here's an elaborate explanation of what geological processes and phenomena students observed and study:

1. Seafloor Topography and Bathymetry: Geologists aboard the ship used specialized equipment like sonar and echo sounders to map the seafloor topography. They observed and study features such as underwater mountains (seamounts), trenches, ridges, and plateaus. These features are the result of tectonic plate movements and can provide insights into the Earth's geological history.

2. Sedimentation: The ship can be equipped with sediment coring tools that allow geologists to collect sediment samples from the seafloor. The analysis of these sediments can reveal information about past climate conditions, ocean circulation patterns, and the deposition of minerals and organic materials.

5. Marine Fossils: By examining sediment and rock samples collected from the seafloor, geologists can discover marine fossils and microfossils. These fossils can help determine past environmental conditions, including ocean temperature, salinity, and nutrient levels.

7. **Mineral Resources:** Geologists can investigate the potential for seafloor mineral resources such as polymetallic nodules, cobalt-rich ferromanganese crusts, and hydrothermal vent deposits.
